- 1.1.4 Name any TWO organisations that promoted Afrikaner Nationalism. (2 x 1) (2)
- 1.1.5 Use your own knowledge to explain why working-class Afrikaners saw blacks as a threat in the labour-market. (2 x 2) (4)

- 1.2.1 List any TWO organisations formed by the Broederbond to promote Afrikaner Nationalism. (2 x 1) (2)
- 1.2.2 What, according to the information in the source, did the Afrikaner Broederbond control? (2 x 1) (2)

- 1.4.1 What message does the photograph convey with regards to the centenary celebrations? (2 x 2) (4)
- 1.4.2 Name the organisation/person that was behind the organisation of the centenary celebrations. (1 x 2) (2)
- 1.5 Using the information in the relevant sources and your own knowledge, write a paragraph of about SIX lines (about 60 words) explaining how different organisations contributed to the development of Afrikaner Nationalism. (6)

2.2.1 Use the information in the source to explain what 'Resolution 181' entailed. (1 x 2) (2)

2.2.2 According to the source, which country controlled Palestine? (1 x 2) (2)

2.2.3 Using the information in the source and your own knowledge, explain why 'Resolution 181' was rejected by the Arab Palestinians. (2 x 2) (4)

2.2.4 Comment on why this war is also called the 'War of Independence'. (2 x 2) (4)

2.2.5 Why do you think the Arab Palestinians referred to this war as 'al-Nakba' (disaster or catastrophe)? (2 x 2) (4)

2.2.6 Name any THREE Arab countries that invaded Israel during the First Israeli War. (3 x 1) (3)

2.3.2 Comment on why the woman carried the key with her for 35 years. (1 x 2) (2)

- 2.4.1 What message does the photograph convey with regards to the Middle East conflict? (1 x 2) (2)
- 2.4.2 Identify TWO features from the photo which show that the refugees suffered. (2 x 1) (2)
- 2.5 Using the information in the relevant sources and your own knowledge, write a paragraph of about SIX lines (about 60 words) explaining how Jewish nationalism led to conflict and suffering for the people of Palestine. (6)

- 3.1.3 How, according to the source, could rights of residents to stay in a particular town be revoked? (2 x 1) (2)
- 3.1.4 Comment on the rights that 'Section 10 people' had over migrant workers who moved from rural areas to urban areas. (2 x 2) (4)

3.2 Study Source 3B.

- 3.2.1 What did the policeman demand from Bloke's father? (2 x 1) (2)
- 3.2.2 Comment on the attitude of the policeman towards the men in the house. (2 x 2) (4)
- 3.2.3 Using the information in the source and your own knowledge, explain the effects of the pass raid on Bloke Modisane. (2 x 2) (4)
- 3.2.4 What, according to the source, was the attitude of Modisane's father towards the police raid? (2 x 1) (2)
- 3.2.5 Comment on the usefulness of the information in the source to a historian studying how the pass law was implemented for black South Africans. (2 x 2) (4)

- 3.3.1 What message is portrayed in this photograph regarding the carrying of passes? (1 x 2) (2)
- 3.3.2 Why, do you think, it was a requirement for black South Africans to carry passes at all times? (2 x 2) (4)
- 3.3.3 Explain what could happen to black South Africans who were not in possession of a pass. (2 x 2) (4)

- 3.4.1 What, according to the source, was the opinion of Luthuli regarding the pass laws? (3 x 1) (3)
- 3.4.2 Quote a sentence from the source which indicates that black South Africans were against the pass laws. (1 x 2) (2)
- 3.4.3 Using the information in the source and your own knowledge, explain how peace and harmony will be achieved in South Africa. (2 x 2) (4)
- 3.5. Using the information in the relevant sources and your own knowledge, write a paragraph of about SIX lines (about 60 words) explaining how the Pass Laws affected the lives of black South Africans. (6)
