NOTE: There must be a connection between your essay and the picture.

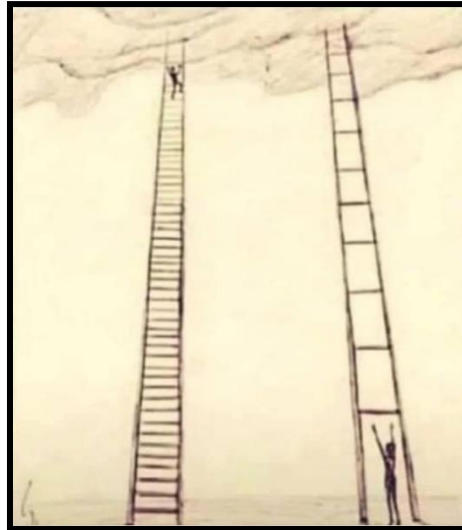

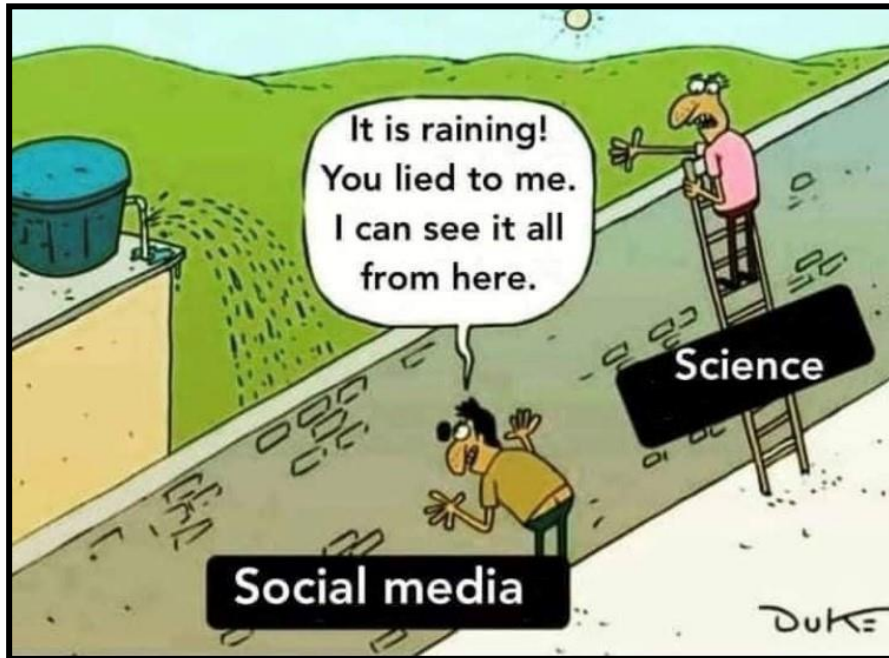

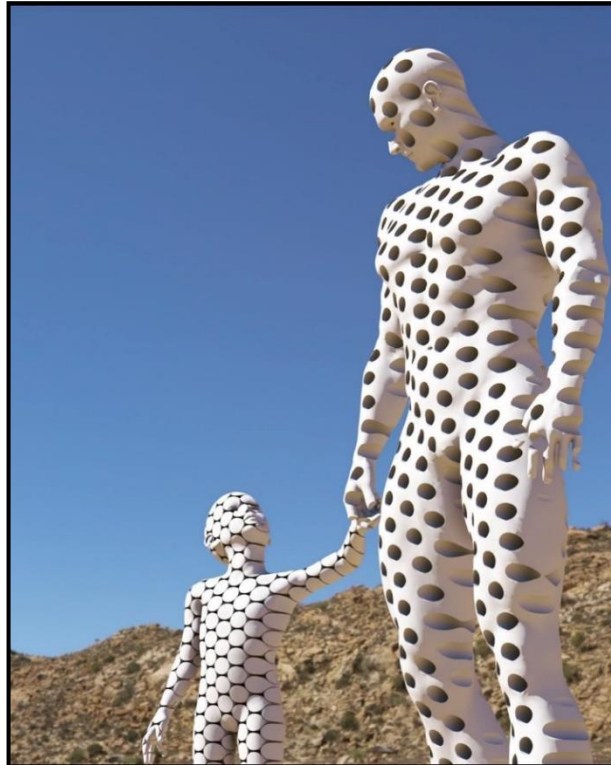
