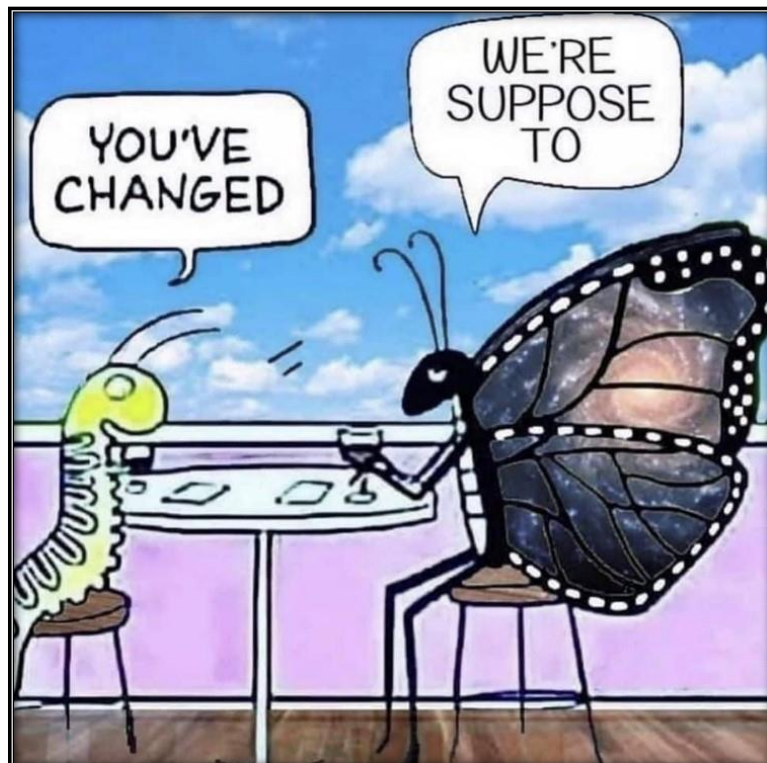
QUESTION 1

NOTE: There must be a clear link between your essay and the picture you have chosen.

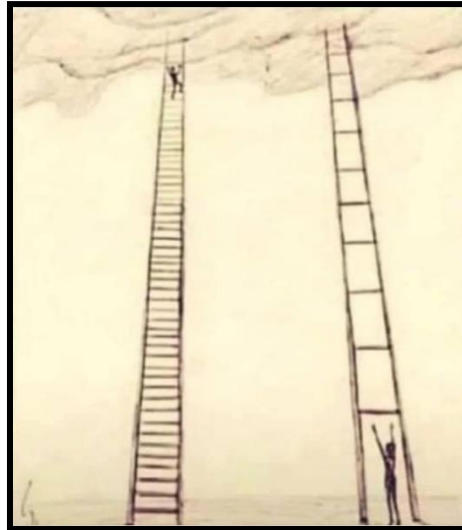

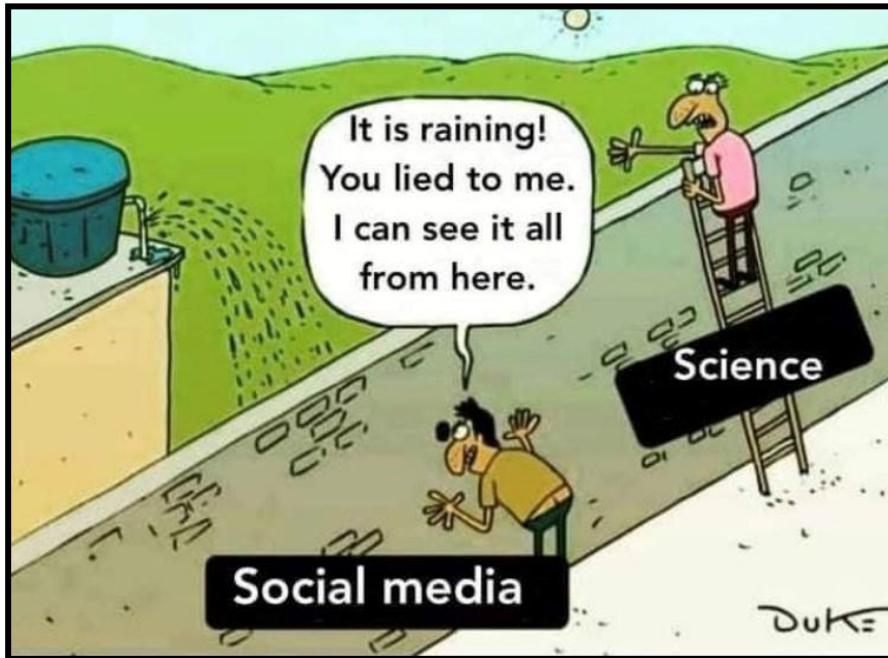

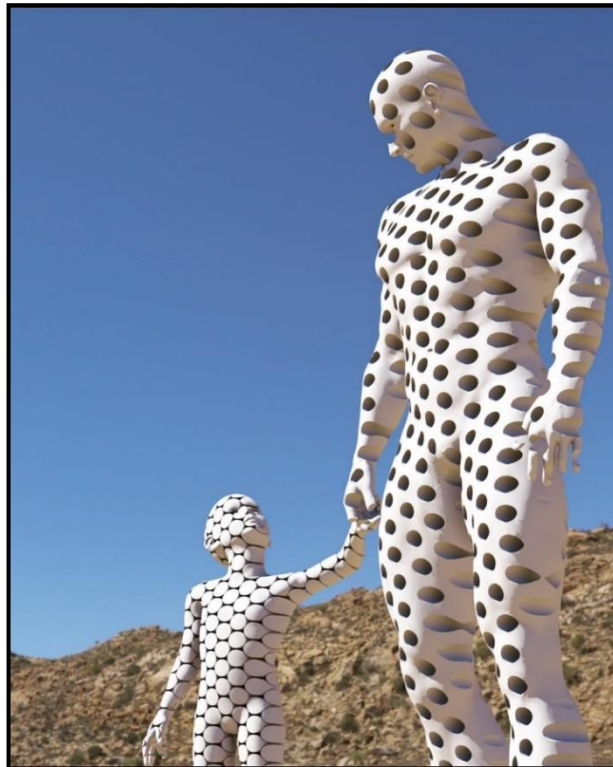
