South Africa's labour laws are some the best in the world.

The Constitution also includes labour law rights.

Trade unions are allowed to give input into labour laws.

South Africa's labour law is the Basic Conditions of Employment Act (BCEA), 1997 (Act 75 of 1997).

Employers and workers must follow this act.

An important part of this Act is the regulations<sub>(rules)</sub> of a job contract.

Every employer must give all workers a contract on the first day of employment.

Few workers read the job contract before signing it.

Even though South African labour laws are clear, child labour continues to exist in the country.

It is important that employers have a good understanding of the BCEA to make sure that they work within the law.
