MAIN INSTRUCTIONS

Source-based task

Activity 1

Read the extract below and answer the questions that follow.

Conflict resolution and communication skills: the art of stress-free living!!!!

Most youths suffer from various psychological and emotional challenges due to their inability to resolve their personal and interpersonal challenges. The inability to maintain your cool or apply good decision-making skills and mingle better with your friends is what may later affect you at school and at the places of work. The early stages of a person's development are responsible for what that individual will become later in life. That involves the person's maturity levels in terms of social interaction, physical development, emotional aspects of life, coping skills, communication, etc. In summary, the type of attitude one may have developed towards life and people in general is mostly dependent on what the person is exposed to on daily basis. Therefore, the quality of a person's life is informed by the manner that individual has been raised. They usually say, the extent to which a tree may grow is dependent on the type of nutrients it was fed with.

On the other hand, communication in social relationships may enable an individual an opportunity to mend broken relationships, as a consequence of unresolved conflict. Having conflict does not mean all is lost. A person may change the situation through the correct usage of communication skills. For example, conflict may arise as a result of misunderstanding, attitudes and values, personality etc. To illustrate, people have different personalities which may either enhance or frustrate effective communication. Often, there could be friction between spoken words and the body language of the communicator leading to unnecessary conflicts. The receiver of the message does not only receive spoken words, but those words are accompanied by unspoken words, i.e., body language.

So, for relationships to be built and sustained, one has to have a way of applying effective communication skills. Inconsistent verbal communication ¹cues often affect the flow of communication between friends. The unintended results could be development of stress which may require stress management skills with which one may

be able to lessen the negative impact of stress due to conflict and inability to communicate clearly or openly.

Other factors are beyond a person's control and have a huge potential to negatively affect ²pursuance of life goals; for example, change in circumstances which includes personal, social, work etc. may affect a person's attempt to achieve various life goals. Unfortunately, there is no shortcut; one must experience the stress of ³transiting from school to post school destinations which may require adaptation skills and preparations to succeed. This change brings both positive and negative experiences to a person.

Read the extract below and answer the questions that follow.

The art of time management as an examination writing skill and the negative effects of inability to plan!!!

Stress is a common occurrence in today's life; there will always be many things to do and not enough time. Time is a scarce ¹commodity which requires understanding and the ability to plan and prioritise your daily activities. For learners, developing appropriate examination writing skills is important. Studying without a plan may affect your ability to give the necessary attention to the various subjects. Consequently, you may do the subjects you feel comfortable with, at the expense of the other subjects. As you proceed from one grade to the other, it becomes important that you revise your own study skills, strategies, styles, time management and examination writing skills. Even if you may be given sufficient time to do certain things, the likelihood is that you may not be able to complete all tasks on time. For you to complete all your activities on time, you will be required to adopt strategies towards effective usage of time. The inability to do that could result in negative feelings which may affect your ability to live a quality life. The failure in executing your tasks may ²linger on and that could cause stress, depression, fear etc.

Notably, a certain amount of stress is ³inevitable and is a useful part of life. In an academic setting, a healthy amount of stress motivates students to work harder, be focused and return to studies rather than doing something else. It may also help them during an examination session. Most students fail their examinations not because they do not know the content, but because they could not apply appropriate examination writing skills.

Essentially, if students are too stressed, they cannot study effectively. High levels of stress or chronic stress can interfere with a student's ability to learn, memorize, and earn good grades. It could also lead to poor physical, emotional and mental wellbeing. Effective time management can drastically reduce stress, especially academic stress. Time management is inversely proportional to stress. Successful time management will help you to become effective in completing tasks. Therefore, it

is important for you to take care of yourself ahead of your exams and make time for self-care.

Activity 3

Read the extract below and answer the questions that follow.

Entrepreneurship as an innovative strategy to counteract unemployment

South Africa, along with the rest of the world, is facing a youth employment crisis of ¹unprecedented proportions. The country's National Youth Policy (NYP) of 2009-2014 made mention of the mid-year population estimates for 2008 where the young people (aged 14 - 35) are said to comprise 37.4%. It confirms that the vast majority of the South African population constitutes the youth, while the population statistics indicate that the youth also constitute a significant proportion of the adult population.

According to the International Labour Organisation (ILO), it is claimed that young people today are more than three times as likely to be unemployed and being without work compared to adults. That means the majority of the youth generation will have a limited chance of being employed and that may lead to poverty and various social challenges.

A matriculation certificate also, does not guarantee employment of those wishing to enter the labour market after school. Many graduates are ²languishing the streets of South Africa with little hope for employment. It could be related to the rapid changes in the job market and the coming into being of new careers. The era of the 4th Industrial Revolution (4IR) has ³ushered in new opportunities which require new set of skills. Unfortunately, the changes in the means of production have overtaken skills development or procurement of competing skills to ensure employment of, especially, the youth.

To overcome the rapid rise of the statistics of the unemployed, self-employment and entrepreneurship in South Africa seem to be the only available means of earning an income, provided one becomes serious about these pathways.
