- 4.1 Patch pocket with no top stitch
- 4.2 The pocket itself is used to finish off the edges
- 4.3 Wrap bias around cord
- 4.4 Disposal of fullness that add the fullness of the garment part
- 4.5 One stitch fold in the fabric
- 4.6 The pocket piece and facing piece are stitched together
- 4.7 Collar that lie flat on the shoulder
- 4.8 Collar with a seam at the back of the collar
- 4.9 Garment cut with the extension above the waistline
- 4.10 The sleeve is cut as an extension of the bodice

**SECTION B****QUESTION 5**

- 5.1
- Fuse the interfacing.
  - Fold half the width of the waistband.
  - Divide the waistband into four sections and pin one layer to the right side of the garment.
  - Stitch and press.
  - Turn the other edge and stitch along the waist seam. (5 × 2) (10)
- 5.2 To take away fullness. (2)
- 5.3 To add fullness. (2)
- 5.4
- Darts must be in the same position and length.
  - Darts must be pressed flat in correct direction.
  - Thread and stitching quality must be correct.
  - Dart points must be back-tacked to avoid unravelling.
  - Dart markings should be carefully aligned to prevent twisted darts. (5 × 2) (10)
