- Knitted fabrics stretch in one or both directions.
 - They are easy to wear, since they stretch to fit the shape and movement of the body.
 - Knitted fabrics recover easily from crumpling.
 - The construction of knitted fabrics is porous.
 - Can be worn for warmth or coolness. (5 × 2) (10)
