4.1	Very narrow tuck of which there can be more than one.
4. I	very harrow tuck or which there can be more than one.

- 4.2 The edges of two folded lines of a pleat brought towards each other.
- 4.3 A seam formed when two layers of fabric are joined together.
- 4.4 The pocket which is visible on the outside of the garment.
- 4.5 Self-enclosed seam in which all the seam allowances are contained within the finished seam.
- 4.6 The pocket in a horizontal seam of skirts and trousers just below the waistband.
- The collar that stands against the neck, then falls over the stand and rests on the garment.
- 4.8 The sleeve cut as an extension of the bodice; mostly loose-fitting.
- The cuff for which the fabric is cut double in width so that it can fold back onto itself.
- 4.10 A pattern piece fitting around the hips to hold the gathers in position.
