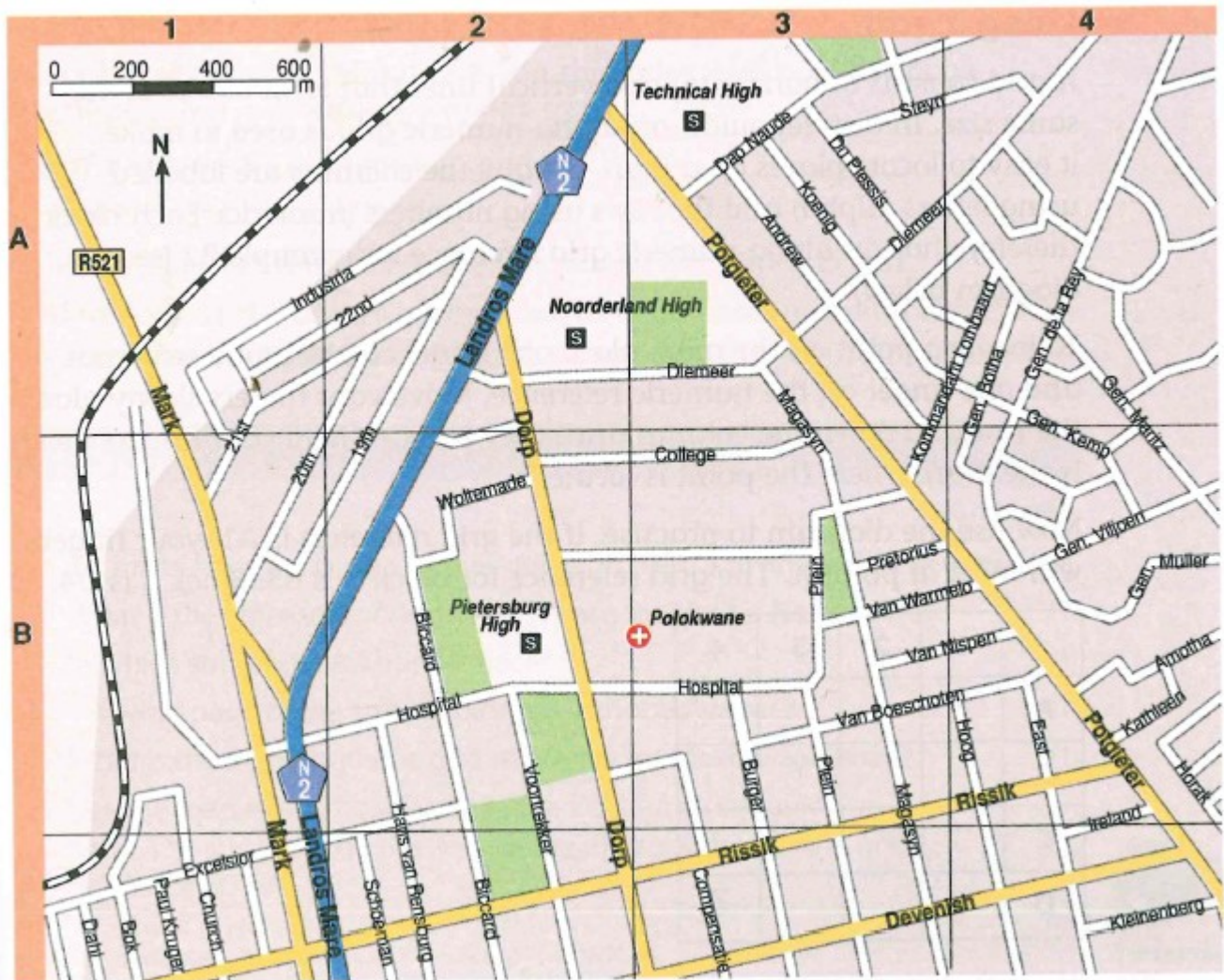

 Improve drainage in settlements so that water can flow away quickly.	 Make laws that prevent people from living in high-risk flood areas.
 Teach people about the dangers of flooding.	 Use lakes, natural vegetation, and wetlands to prevent water from flowing too quickly into rivers.
